While the internet allows us to learn about events, and research and view works of art and culture we would never be able to enjoy otherwise, many people I know are stepping away from on-line social media for a variety of reasons—fake news, trolls, fear of identity theft, nothing of any real interest, it's a time sink, the news is just too depressing, too many disagreeable types, etc. I am not one of those people, and I hope if you are stepping away from social media, you may reconsider.

I believe that social media provides the public agora, or marketplace of ideas, so vital to our democracy, and that has been to some degree lost by social isolation from those whose opinions and ideas differ. Consider that Facebook and Twitter, for example, are virtual versions of Hyde Park Speakers Corner in London, where anyone can speak about anything, and anyone else can choose to stop and listen, argue or agree--or not. The speaker may be deranged, and it's not always comfortable to have one's ideas challenged, but--there's still a value...when I do respond to something I disagree with on a media platform, I find I'm forced to think through and clarify in my own mind what my position is, and why I believe it to be true. And sometimes, when the world seems too absurd, I occasionally find a gem of insight that leaves me nodding my head in agreement, like this quote from SottoVoce..."When words fail, when we are lost and don't know where to turn, art speaks for us."
